

What is an integrated care system?



Integrated care systems are partnerships of organisations that come together to plan and deliver joined up health and care services to improve the lives of people in their area.

They will be responsible for how health and care is planned, paid for and delivered.

There are six places in the South West London Integrated Care System

- The South West London Integrated Care System is made up of six places (boroughs) service a population of 1.5 million. These six Places are co-terminus with our six Local Authority boroughs.
- There are 41 local neighbourhoods within these places.
- These 41 neighbourhoods are aligned with the Primary Care Networks that have served their communities since they were established in 2019.





People and communities engagement strategy


- To support SWL ICS, a SWL people and communities engagement strategy has been developed and approved following engagement with partners.
- The strategy will continue to evolve and sets out how we will ensure the voices of people and communities in SWL are heard and influence how we plan and deliver local services
- Our Kingston Place approach will be informed by:
 - Elements of SWL strategy e.g. aims, principles, companion documents, lessons learned, role of borough C&E group, role of Place lead for C&E, evaluation framework
 - Primary care networks and the locality model development
 - Place leadership
 - Input from and review of CCG engagement forums e.g. Kingston patient and public forum
 - Input from borough comms and engagement group (C&E professionals from partner organisations)

With the emergence of the Omicron variant of COVID-19 and subsequent changes to the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation's guidance, an already busy time is only set to get busier as we approach the festive season with the aim of protecting as many people as possible from COVID-19 and flu.

Pressure from the public who are keen to receive booster vaccinations as well as a lack of clarity around the possible impact of the new variant makes for an uncertain time, but it's good to see that work continues to support our partnership working. 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


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Kingston and Richmond planning meeting:


