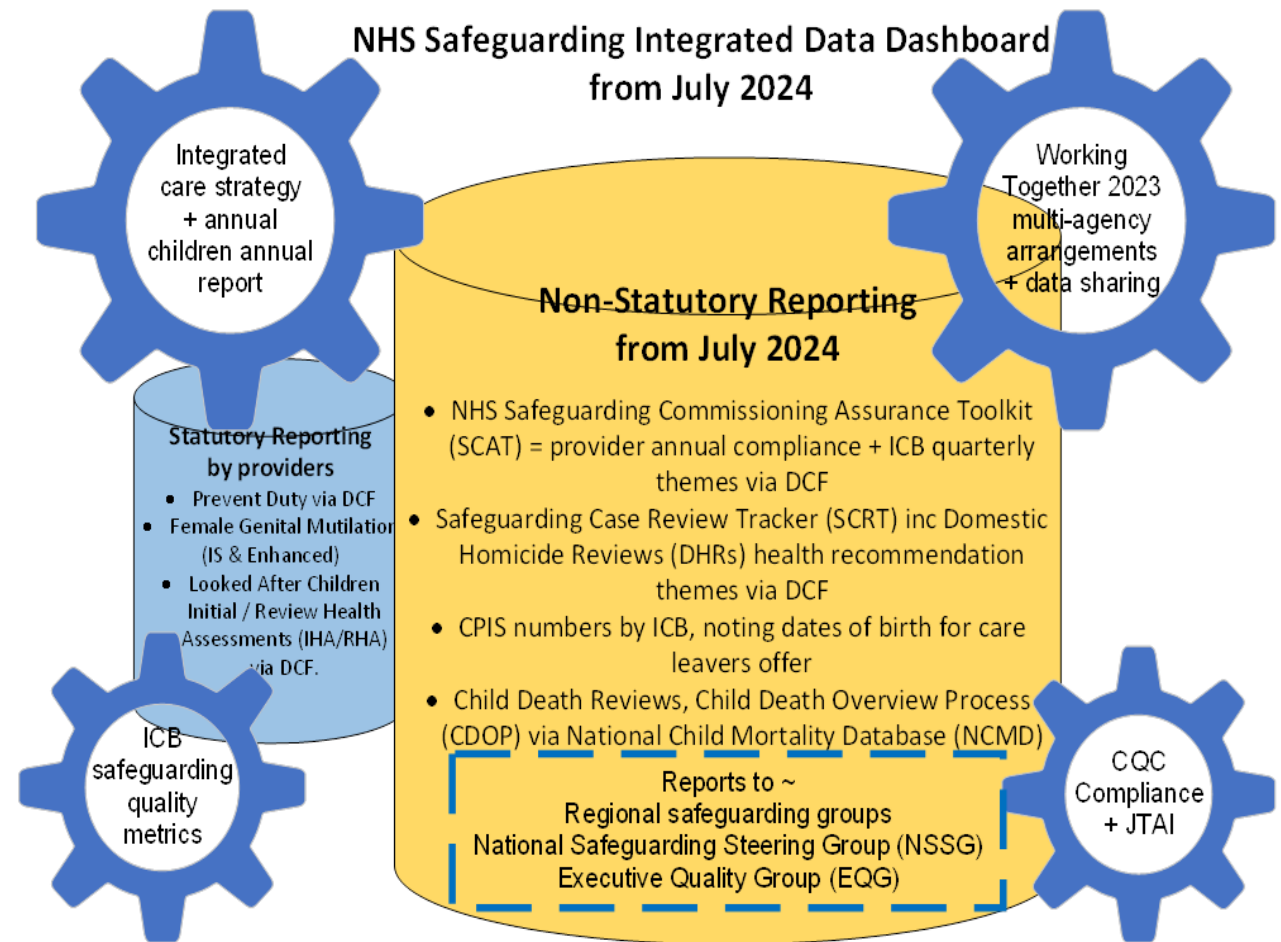
- Launched on the 17th November 2021. Integrated Care Boards (ICBs) in London commenced inputting on to the NHS Safeguarding Case Review Tracker (S-CRT) in Q3 2021/22
- A secure web-based tool, designed by NHS England and NHS Digital enables ICB designated safeguarding professionals to update the status of statutory reviews and pull off review summaries for their ICB area.
- Accessible to National and regional NHS England safeguarding leads, for the purposes of regional monitoring and analysis. Further info can be found here: [About the tracker](#)

Purpose:

- Produces live data including number of cases open and closed, themes of incidents and learning from any recommendations, that can be shared across the systems.
- Enables consistent oversight and reporting for ICBs and ICSs across their geographies and can function as the single repository of Domestic Homicide Reviews, Child Safeguarding Practice Reviews, Safeguarding Adult Reviews and Rapid Reviews (no. of rapid reviews that convert to a CSPR/SAR/DHR), to support report for National and Regional Safeguarding meetings.
- Supports the delivery of safeguarding statutory duties across all agencies involved in safeguarding.

NHS Safeguarding Integrated Data Dashboard (NHS SIDDD)

- The S-CRT data feeds into the NHS Safeguarding Integrated Data Dashboard to support assurance of provider contractual obligations and ICB executive accountabilities for statutory safeguarding programmes.
- Live from 1st March .The NHS Safeguarding Integrated Data Dashboard (NHS SIDDD) is a collection of commissioning assurance data between providers, ICBs, regional safeguarding teams and the National Safeguarding Steering Group (NSSG). Live from 1st March 2024.



- The Safeguarding case review tracker collects the following data:
- Statutory reviews including, Safeguarding Adult Reviews, Domestic Homicide Reviews, Child Safeguarding Practice Reviews and Rapid Reviews. Each of the above safeguarding case reviews should have the following information recorded:

- ICB Quality oversight verification of health recommendations from Domestic Homicide Reviews
- The starting point for a case to be included as 'open' is the formal commissioning of the review by the local safeguarding or community safeguarding partnership. The case will be recorded as 'closed' at the point at which the review report is completed, signed off and published or not publication is embargoed.
- Non identifiable patient data. (No PID should be entered on the tracker)

London Safeguarding Case Review Tracker Guidance

- London SCR Task to Finish Group (commenced in May 23) have developed an ICB SCR Tracker Guidance to support Integrated Care Board Safeguarding designates in accessing and inputting on the NHS Safeguarding Case Review Tracker (S-CRT).
- Guidance includes a Quality checklist to support implementation and level of quality of inputting on the tracker.
- London ICBs using quality checklist to audit use and quality of inputting on the tracker.
- Each ICB has access to the infographic template to use locally for reporting.
- Task to Finish group evolved into a working group with a greater focus on sharing the learning and recommendations from Safeguarding Case Reviews across London.
- Learning has supported input on S-CRT Safeguarding operational protocols.
- Guidance being adapted by other regions













